## DAY 1: TUESDAY, JUNE 19 - DEPARTURE FROM LOS ANGELES

This afternoon, depart from Los Angeles for Europe on regularly scheduled airlines such as Lufthansa.

## DAY 2: WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20 - VIENNA, AUSTRIA

Change planes at the airline's hub and continue on a short flight to your final destination. Welcome to Vienna, the "World Capital of Music." Meet our local representative upon arrival at the airport, and transfer by private motorcoach to your centrally located hotel. Enjoy a welcome dinner with your fellow classmates this evening. (D)

## DAY 3: THURSDAY, JUNE 21 - VIENNA

This morning, take part in city tour of Vienna, including the imperial palaces, architectural art nouveau masterpieces, and coffee houses crammed with rich cakes and baroque mirrors. Later, visit the gothic St. Stephen's cathedral, view the historic monuments lining the Ringstrasse Boulevard and enjoy a view of the city from Belvedere Palace. Today's lunch will be served at a typical Viennese restaurant. In the afternoon, you will have class instruction at the University of Vienna. (B,L)

## DAY 4: FRIDAY, JUNE 22 - VIENNA

After breakfast, take a field trip to the Schoenbrunn Palace and Gardens, the elegant baroque residence of the Habsburg dynasty until 1918. Class



instruction at the University of Vienna in the afternoon. (B,L)

## DAY 5: SATURDAY, JUNE 23 - VIENNA

Class instruction in the morning. The afternoon remains without scheduled activities. (B,L)

## DAY 6: SUNDAY, JUNE 24 - VIENNA

Morning and afternoon remain without scheduled activities. Enjoy dinner at a traditional Vienna Heurigen restaurant this evening. (B,D)

## DAY 7: MONDAY, JUNE 25 - VIENNA

Class instruction in the morning. The afternoon is free. Tonight enjoy a performance at the Vienna State Opera. Performance and time tba. (B)

## DAY 8: TUESDAY, JUNE 26 - VIENNA

Class instruction in the morning. The rest of the day remains without scheduled activities. (B)

## DAY 9: WEDNESDAY, JUNE 27 - VIENNA TO MAUTHAUSEN, SALZKAMMERGUT LAKE DISTRICT AND SALZBURG

After breakfast, travel west on the Autobahn, past Vienna Woods and Alpine foothills. Cross the Danube River and visit the former Nazi concentration camp of Mauthausen. Later, travel south and enter the Alps and the Salzkammergut Lake District. Admire the beautiful scenery along Lake Mondsee and stop at the picturesque village of St. Gilgen. You will have the opportunity for a summer toboggan ride down Alpine meadows (optional) or for walking along the lakeshore. In the early evening, continue to Salzburg for a five-night stay. (B,D)

## DAY 10: THURSDAY, JUNE 28 - SALZBURG

This morning, participate in a city tour of Salzburg. Discover, Mirabell Palace, Old Town, Residence Palace and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's birth house, now a museum. Also, ascend by cable car to the majestic Festung Hohensalzburg castle for dinner, followed by a classical concert. (B,D)

## DAY 11: FRIDAY, JUNE 29 - SALZBURG, BERCHTESGADEN, LAKE KÖNIGSEE, GERMANY

A field trip to nearby Germany is on today's agenda. Travel to Berchtesgaden and up the Alpine road to visit Hitler's former mountain hideaway Berghof;

the Eagle's Nest as it was called. Then enjoy a tranquil boat ride on Lake Königsee, offering spectacular views of the Alpine peaks such as the Hochkönig and its glacier. Return to Salzburg in the evening, where dinner will be served at a local restaurant. (B,D)

## DAY 12: SATURDAY, JUNE 30 - SALZBURG

Day at leisure. (B)

## DAY 13: SUNDAY, JULY 1 - SALZBURG TO VENICE, ITALY

This morning, you will travel south, through the Austrian state of Carinthia, and into Italy. As you pass through Italy's Dolomite region you will experience a remarkable change of landscape, architecture and climate. You have left Central Europe and arrived in the Mediterranean. Spend your first three Italian nights in Venice. This evening take vaporetto (water bus) transportation to the historic center. Enjoy dinner at a traditional Italian restaurant, followed by the quintessential romantic Venetian experience; a gondola ride. (B,D)

## DAY 14: MONDAY, JULY 2 - VENICE

Participate in a walking tour of Venice this morning. Learn about the city's vanished greatness, its myths and intrigues. Experience its romance, the cool sea breeze, and the overwhelming wealth of its art masterpieces. (B)

## DAYS 15: TUESDAY, JULY 3 - VENICE

Day at leisure. (B)

## DAY 16: WEDNESDAY, JULY 4 - VENICE TO FLORENCE

Today, travel from Venice to Florence. Traverse the fertile Northern Italian plains where River Po provides the resource for Italy's agricultural heartland. Travel by Padua, Ferrara and Bologna. Cross the Apennine Mountain range and enter the Tuscany region, where perfectly preserved hilltop citadels dot the countryside, and fields of sunflowers bow in the perpetual sunlight. Tonight's dinner will be served in a traditional trattoria. (B,D)

## DAY 17: THURSDAY, JULY 5 - FLORENCE

This morning, participate in a walking tour of the town. During several hundred years, Florence was the cradle of exceptional artistic and intellectual



activity. While staying in Florence, become witness of its unparalleled concentration of art and architecture. Visit the Academy Museum, repository of Michelangelo statues, such as David. Visit the Duomo, see Ghiberti's Gates of Paradise at the side of the Baptistery, marvel the Signoria Palace, the Ponte Vecchio and continue to the Basilica of Santa Croce with its tombs of Michelangelo, Galileo and other legendary individuals. (B)

#### **DAY 18: FRIDAY, JULY 6 - FLORENCE**

The morning remains without scheduled activities. In the afternoon, take part in an excursion into the Tuscan hills. Learn about the Italian art of making and enjoying pasta. For details, please look at [www.accidentaltourist.com](http://www.accidentaltourist.com). (B)

#### **DAY 19 – SATURDAY, JULY 7 - FLORENCE TO SIENA TO ROME**

Visit mystical, gentle and passionate Siena, the beloved art center south of Florence, on your way to Rome. Siena is smaller than Florence and has preserved its walkable character. Explore its cobblestone piazzas, winding streets and gothic city walls, before continuing through Tuscan and Umbrian countryside on your way to Rome. Tonight's dinner will be served at a Typical Roman trattoria. Following the dinner, you will have the opportunity to stroll around old Rome at night, visiting landmark sites such as Piazza Navona. (B,D)

#### **DAY 20: SUNDAY, JULY 8 - ROME**

In the morning, take part in a city tour of the Eternal City. Experience the Roman Forum, the Pantheon, the Colosseum, and an array of temples, arches and statues. In the afternoon, continue to the Galleria Borghese Museum, containing Bernini, Caravaggio, Rubens and Titian masterpieces. (B)

#### **DAY 21: MONDAY, JULY 9 - ROME**

This morning, participate in a tour of the Vatican. Visit the Vatican Museums with its priceless pieces of art in the Greek-Roman section of the Pio Clementino Museum, the Etruscan Museum, the Raphael Rooms and last but not least Sistine Chapel, illustrated by Michelangelo, including the Creation and the Last Judgment. Continue to St. Peter's Basilica with its numerous masterpieces including Michelangelo's Pieta, and where the pontiff gives his benediction. The rest of the day is without scheduled activities. (B)

#### **DAY 22: TUESDAY, JULY 10 - ROME**

A field trip to Ostia Antica, the military port from where the Romans embarked on their conquest of the Mediterranean. In modern days, Ostia Antica serves as the beach of Rome. It's just the appropriate place for a grand finale of this study abroad program; a beach party. Return to the Eternal City for an "arrivederci Roma" and tonight's farewell dinner. (B,D)

#### **DAY 23 – WEDNESDAY, JULY 11 - DEPARTURE DAY**

Transfer to the airport to board your flight to Los Angeles, or extend your stay in Europe on your own. (B)

## *Cultural Program*

### **VIENNA, AUSTRIA**

Vienna, Austria's capital, is one of the world's most beautiful cities. Grandiose Vienna was the showpiece of the Habsburg Dynasty. Monumental edifices line the city centre, world-class museums burst with treasures, white stallions strut their way down mirrored halls, and renowned orchestras perform in lavish concert halls. Vienna offers plenty of delights - walks in the woods, swimming in the Danube river, indulgent afternoons in its renowned coffee and pastry houses, as well as a bustling nightlife. Discover Vienna's unique ambience, where music seems to be everywhere and some of the world's most famous composer's (Beethoven, Mozart, Schubert and Mahler) were inspired.



### **SALZBURG, AUSTRIA**

The city is noted for its baroque architecture and Alpine setting. It was the birthplace of Mozart and the setting for the world-famous musical and film *The Sound of Music*. Get to know Salzburg and its surroundings through guided tours and museums visits.

### **BERCHTESGADEN, GERMANY**

Located on the German border with Austria, Berchtesgaden is well known for Hitler's former mountain top hideaway, "The Eagle's Nest", and the world famous Salt Mines and subterranean salt lake.

### **VENICE, ITALY**

The three-night stay in "La Serenissima" offers time to relax, as well as to explore the beautiful sights of this most unusual city, where the streets are canals and the houses are built on the water. Cruise on the Grand Canal, stroll through the Piazza San Marco, swim in the warm Adriatic Sea. Venice is a romantic city with palaces and basilicas, artisans and musicians, excellent food and fine shopping.

### **FLORENCE**

Florence is considered the birthplace of the Italian Renaissance and is the jewel of Renaissance history and art. Few places in the world have such a large concentration of masterpieces and monuments. See Michelangelo's David, Botticelli's Venus and Ghiberti's Doors of Paradise. A four-night stay in nearby Montecatini gives participants the opportunity to explore Florence and other sites in the area.

### **ROME**

The capital city of Italy, Rome has been the center of Western civilization for centuries. Its city center is a world heritage UNESCO site and hosts some of the world's best known works of art and monuments. Rome is also one of the world's most important centers of music. It is hard to say what you will find most breathtaking about the eternal city: the opulence of the Vatican, the amount of cats in the Colosseum, or the impressive site of the Forum. Feel the presence of history all around you while you sip cappuccino in one of the many piazzas or enjoy real Italian gelato with the locals.

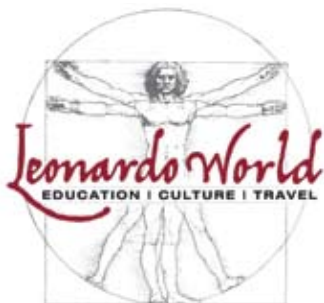
